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Webinar Abstract (150-200 words): In response to the attacks on September 11, 2001, President Bush signed Homeland Security Presidential Directive 5 (HSPD-5) directing the Department of Homeland Security to develop and administer a National Incident Management System (NIMS). Established in 2004, the NIMS provides a consistent nationwide template that enables all government, private sector, and nongovernmental organizations to work together during domestic incidents. A key feature of the NIMS is an Incident Command System (ICS). Hospitals and healthcare organizations that receive federal funding are required to comply with NIMS through implementation of the new Hospital Incident Command System (HICS), an ICS-based incident management system that assists hospitals in improving their emergency management planning, response, and recovery capabilities for unplanned and planned events. The Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations (JCAHO) also requires an all-hazards, comprehensive emergency management program, and an ICS consistent with that in use by the community. This presentation will familiarize participants with the National Response Framework (NRF) and its associated components such as the NIMS and the HICS. It will also summarize the NIMS/HICS implementation activities required by the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) National Bioterrorism Hospital Preparedness Program for hospitals.

Qualifications of presenter to offer this session (No longer than 100 words): Mr. Daniels is a retired Air Force hospital administrator with over 17 years of healthcare experience. He has led military medical control centers during multiple hurricane incidents and led medical emergency planning for a coalition military base in Southwest Asia during Operations ENDURING FREEDOM and SOUTHERN WATCH. In addition to his military emergency preparedness training, Mr. Daniels has completed courses from the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) Emergency Management Institute to include the IS-700, IS-800a, IS-100, IS-100.HC, and IS-200.HC courses.
